100 YEARS AGO

In early 1907, the reservoir was filling up, the town was reeling from the trauma of the last ten years, but in spite of everything, in March of that year, preparations began to celebrate West Boylston's 100th anniversary. A committee was appointed - Leon Goodale, Willie Wood, Warren Gammel, Daniel Lynch and Walter Chapman, A budget of \$200 was voted. For some reason, this turned out to be inadequate, and next year another \$1000 would be provided.
